Anyone who wants to learn more about how to break down the barriers that impact the lives of people who are blind or have low vision, including:

- community interest groups;
- front line staff; and
- community-run organisations.

What will you learn?

Each workshop is tailored to your organisation and purpose in the community. Some of the things you will learn include:

- Our mission and purpose, including gaining a broader understanding of our many services.
- Appropriate Guide Dog etiquette and important access laws.
- An understanding of the functional impact of common vision conditions and what these conditions can mean for people accessing the community.

- The different ways people move around their environment using long canes, Guide Dogs and Assistive Technology to support them to access their community safely and independently.
- How to identify possible barriers to inclusion, and how you can be a part of creating positive change in your local community.
- Practical tips for offering assistance, guiding, providing directions and basic orientation.
- All your questions will be answered during a Q and A with our Lived Experience Presenter.
